

Mandarin Chinese is the official language of Taiwan. The most effective way to learn Mandarin is to study traditional Chinese characters in the modern, Mandarin speaking society of Taiwan.

The National Palace Museum has a great collection of artifacts spanning the history of Chinese civilization. Taiwanese Opera and Glove Puppetry, and aboriginal culture, add to the cultural richness of Taiwan. - 3 Learn Complete, Traditional Chinese Characters**  
Learning traditional characters makes it easy to identify lexical forms and hard to misunderstand the meaning of words. Moreover, the power and aesthetics of Chinese calligraphy can only be revealed and appreciated through traditional Chinese characters.
- 4 An Excellent Environment for Learning Chinese**  
35 Mandarin training centers in Taiwan provide high quality teachers and facilities, a variety of high quality courses for students of all levels of proficiency, and small classes. Most importantly, outside of class, you will be immersed in Chinese language and culture. Don't miss it!

To encourage students from foreign countries to learn Chinese, the government provides two scholarships. In addition, some Chinese learning centers provide scholarships.

# More About Taiwan



## History

The name "Taiwan", meaning "terraced bay", was first used in 1430 by Admiral Cheng Ho of the Ming court. In the 16th century, the Portuguese named the island "Ilha Formosa" meaning "Beautiful Island". The name Formosa was used until the end of WWII.

Situated between northern and southern Asia, Taiwan has long played a crucial role in trade and politics. Taiwan's location brought frequent invasions, but also provided the conditions needed for a modern, prosperous and democratic country.



## Climate

In subtropical, northern Taiwan, the temperature during the cool, mild winters averages 18°C / 64°F. The average temperature rises to 31°C / 88°F during the hot, humid summers. Southern Taiwan has a tropical, marine climate with generally warm and relatively dry weather.

In the mountains, temperate conditions prevail. Snow may accumulate on some of the highest peaks, such as Yu Shan and Ho-Huan Shan. Rain may fall at any time, but the greatest amount usually falls from April to August. Typhoon season is from May to September.

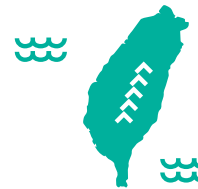
## Culture

The culture of Taiwan is a blend of modern and traditional, national and international, unique and universal. Due to Taiwan's complex political history, the influences of indigenous culture, Confucianism, Japan, and Western civilization all can be seen at the same time.

The Japanese occupation of Taiwan from 1895 to 1945 influenced language, culture, and architecture. Visitors can still find a Japanese-style mansion and hear old Japanese songs emanating from nearby taverns.

Taiwan's aboriginal culture is unique and has started to flourish since the Ami chant "Jubilant Drinking Song" was sampled in a song to promote the 1996 Olympics. However, the dominant culture in Taiwan is still Chinese. Immigrants from mainland China, especially those who arrived in 1949, after civil war, brought Confucianism and Chinese culture to Taiwan. The National Palace Museum has an outstanding collection of 650,000 pieces of ancient Chinese artifacts brought from the Forbidden City, making it a major attraction for visitors. Visitors also will see ornate temples and traditional Chinese characters.

## Geography

Taiwan lies along the western edge of the Pacific Ocean, 193 km (120 miles) off the southeastern coast of mainland China. Taiwan has a land area of about 36,000 square km (14,400 square miles) and is nearly bisected by the Tropic of Cancer. The island is shaped somewhat like a sweet potato.

Taiwan has broad plains, rolling hills, and precipitous mountains that form the spine of the island. There are six peaks over 3,500m - the highest is Yu Shan at 3,952m - and more than 200 peaks over 3,000m. Swift rivers have carved steep gorges through the mountains. Taroko Gorge, with vertical rock walls hundreds of meters high, is a wonder of nature. Geothermal activity has produced many hot springs in mountains.

Due to the abundant rainfall and generally warm temperatures, vegetation grows rampantly in Taiwan, from lowland agricultural crops to all manner of plant life cloaking the hills and mountains. Due to its unique climate and geography, the flora and fauna of Taiwan are tremendously diverse, and many species are endemic to the island.

## Cuisine

In Taiwan, where it seems the people live to eat, it is said that there is a snack shop every three steps and a restaurant every five. Foods and dishes from around the world are available in Taiwan. However, Taiwan's native cuisine, which has gained worldwide attention, is unforgettable - try it just once and you will remember it forever. Memorable dishes include: Pearl Milk Tea, Danzai Noodles, Shrimp Pork Soup, Oyster Omelet, Meat Rice Tamales, Stinky Tofu, Taiwanese Meatballs, Coffin Sandwich, Veggie and Meat Wrap, Oyster Vermicelli, Steamed Sandwich, and Crushed Ice Dessert.

# Step-by-Step Procedures

## Step. 1

Decide to which Chinese learning center you would like to apply.

There are several ways to obtain information about each of the language centers in Taiwan.

- D. Link to each center's website.
- E. Contact a language center for further information.

## Step. 2

Determine the cost of studying at the Chinese learning center, or centers, you are most interested in.

Go to the language center website to obtain information on the following:

- A. Tuition & Registration Fees
- B. Insurance
- C. Housing

## Step. 3

Determine when applications are due and make sure the period of instruction fits your schedule. At some centers, classes may fill quickly, so it is best to send your application well before the deadline.

## Step. 4

Complete your application.

Prepare the following documents for the language center.

- A. A completed application form.
- B. A copy of your passport.
- C. An original copy of your personal financial statement, valid within the last 6 months. The requirements for this statement will be specified by the center.
- D. Diploma/admission letters (varies from center to center).
- E. Research proposal (varies from center to center).
- F. 2-4, 1 x1 inch photos (see learning center website for details).
- G. Insurance certificate.

## Step. 5

If you are accepted, you will receive a formal letter of admission. You must then apply for a visa to study in Taiwan.

## Step. 6

Visa application.

Take the following documents to the nearest ROC embassy, consulate or representative agency to apply for entry visas to enter Taiwan.

- A. A certificate of enrollment issued by the Chinese language center.
- B. Proof of financial support.
- C. A passport, valid for no less than six months and having blank pages sufficient for permits, visas and stamps. In addition, bring one copy of your passport.
- D. One copy of the completed visa application form, to be signed by the applicant in person, and two 2x2-inch color photos taken within from the last six months.
- E. A health certificate issued within the last three months.

# Applying to Learn Chinese in Taiwan

## Scholarships

There are three government-sponsored scholarships dedicated to helping students learn Chinese in Taiwan. The details of each are shown below. In addition, some Chinese learning centers offer scholarships. Information about these can be obtained from each center's website.

### Taiwan Scholarship

# Living in Taiwan

## 1 Accommodations

Some Chinese learning centers provide on-campus dormitories. Each dormitory houses only men or only women. Typically, 4 to 6 students share a room. The number of beds is limited.

If dormitories are unavailable or you prefer a different living arrangement, off-campus apartments, including studios and flats, are available. Most Chinese learning centers provide information about local rentals on the internet. Depending on the accommodation's type, quality and location, rent ranges from NT\$3,000 to 9000 per month. ## 2 Services

### Insurance

Foreigners with an Alien Resident Certificate (ARC) who have resided in Taiwan for four months must enroll in the National Health Insurance (NHI) program at a local administrative office. Before they are eligible for the NHI program, students can purchase their own insurance or participate in a temporary health insurance

program offered by the foreign students' office at their educational institution.

Foreigners, who have lost their residence status because they no longer hold a valid ARC or have left Taiwan permanently, will also lose their right to participate in the NHI program. They must withdraw their subscription to the NHI program through their group insurance applicant (their employers or local administration offices) and then return their NHI card to the group insurance applicant and pay the premiums in full before leaving Taiwan.

When traveling overseas for a short period of time, either on business or on vacation, and then returning to Taiwan with a valid ARC, foreigners must remain enrolled in the NHI program.

### Bank Accounts

Most banks offer foreign currency exchange and bank services in NT dollars. Foreign students can open bank accounts with their passports and ARC cards. Individual who wants to open an account without an ARC card needs to get a universal identification number at the local police office.

### Postage

Chunghwa Post, the postal service of Taiwan, provides international and domestic mail services to the public. There are over a thousand branches, distributed all over the island, providing regular and express postal service. Foreign students can apply for a postal box at the nearest branch.

In addition, most convenience stores serve as pick up locations for international and domestic

express services. Students who receive Taiwan Scholarship need to open an account at a post office of Chunghwa Post.

## 3 Work

International students who have attended school in Taiwan for two semesters or a language program for one year, and who have an excellent academic record, can work in Taiwan when one of the following applies:

- Events of a serious nature have affected their financial ability to support themselves or continue their education, and the student can provide evidence of such circumstances.
- An academic research institution at the student's school requires a foreign student to provide assistance in its work.
- The student needs to take part in an off-campus internship related to his or her field of study.

## Transportation



### By Motorcycle/Scooter & Bicycle

Motorcycles and scooters are very popular means of transportation. Most universities provide motorcycle/scooter parking around campus for students. Bicycles are widely used within campuses. Bicycle racks can be found throughout campuses.



### By Highway Bus

Long distance highway bus services provided by private transportation companies are very popular. They have an extensive network and a frequent service schedule. Tickets are usually competitively priced and some bus companies even provide 24 hour service.



### By Passenger Car

In Taiwan, cars are driven on the right. Students with international driver licenses may drive in Taiwan. However, driving is not recommended for those who are unfamiliar with the unique road and traffic conditions in Taiwan. Traffic is heavy and car drivers must watch out for slow-moving pedestrians and bicyclists, fast-moving motorcycles and scooters, as well as other cars, buses and trucks. Drivers have to be extra cautious. International or foreign driver license holders can apply for ROC driver licenses at the local Motor Vehicles Office.



### By Air

There are six domestic airlines providing services between major cities such as Taipei, Taichung, Tainan, Kaohsiung and Hualien. Prior reservations are always required.



### By Train

The railway network along the coastline is another economic option for traveling around Taiwan. There are four classes of passenger seats: Tze-chiang, Chu-kuang, Fu-hsing and economy. Traveling by train is recommended on public holidays because it can avoid the hustle and bustle of the long distance highway bus service. Advanced ticket reservations are recommended.



### By Taiwan High Speed Rail (THSR)

If you would like to save time, THSR is another choice. While traveling from Taipei to Kaohsiung takes 5 hours by train and 6 hours by car, the THSR takes only 1.5 hours. Advanced reservations are recommended.



### By Metro / Subway

In Taipei and Kaohsiung, the metro system (MRT) provides convenient and comfortable transportation. There are nine major routes in Taipei and two major routes in Kaohsiung, covering different parts of the two cities. Metro fares range from NTD20-60(USD0.6-1.8).



### By Bus & Taxi

Each major city has its own bus system. Fares are inexpensive and service is frequent. Taxi fares start at NTD 70 (USD 2.1) and increase with the time and distance traveled. It is a good idea to have the name of your hotel or address written in Chinese when you travel by taxi.

# Test of Chinese as a Foreign Language (TOCFL)

## 1 Organization Introduction

The Steering Committee for the Test Of Proficiency-Huayu (SC-TOP) was established in November 2005 under the direction of the Ministry of Education of R.O.C. Originally "Chinese Language Testing Center" and renamed in January, 2007, the Committee aims to develop and promote an effective Chinese assessment system, mainly the Test of Chinese as a Foreign Language (TOCFL), for Chinese learners worldwide to assess their Chinese proficiency.

## 2 Test Introduction

TOCFL is a foreign language proficiency test for non-native speakers of Chinese. Those who wish to know about their level of Chinese proficiency, or those who want to study, work or do business in Chinese speaking countries are welcome to register for the test.

TOCFL is administrated in four levels, For Beginners, Basic, Intermediate, and Advanced.

For the Basic, Intermediate and Advanced levels of TOCFL, each level has three sections, including listening, vocabulary and grammar, and reading. The total number of test items is 120, and the total testing time is 110 minutes.

The For Beginners level of TOCFL measures both listening and reading skills of non-native Chinese speakers at the beginning level. The first test was administrated in Nov. 2007. The total number of test items is 80, and the total testing time is 80 minutes.

TOCFL is given in multiple-choice items. Test takers get one point for each correct answer. There is no penalty deduction for the incorrect answer.

## 3 Target Test Taker

The TOCFL for Advanced level is designed for:

- A. Non-native speakers of Chinese.
- B. Test takers who have taken 960 hours of Chinese courses in Taiwan or 1920 hours in countries and areas other than Taiwan.
- C. Test takers who have acquired a vocabulary base of 8000 words.

## 4 Test Content

The authentic materials used in the TOCFL are extracted from materials in daily life, such as advertisements, public announcements, notices, letters, memos, time schedules, and weather broadcasts. In addition, these diversified texts are derived from a variety of fields, including literature, science, art, astronomy, and history.

■ Note: The total Chinese course hours required for overseas Chinese learner need to be doubled.

## 5 Test Format

The content of the test in general focuses on everyday speech incorporated in various situations.

### A. For Beginners

The test measures both listening and reading skills of non-native Chinese speakers at the beginning level. The total number of items is 80, all in multiple-choice format each with three options (except for Part 4 in the reading section). The total testing time is 80 minutes. Each correct answer will be calculated as 1 point. Please see the following table for detail.

### B. Basic/ Intermediate/ Advanced

The Basic level has three sections including listening, vocabulary and grammar, and reading in the test. The total numbers of question are 120, and all of them are multiple choices, of which each has 4 options in the test. The total testing time is 110 minutes.

## 6 Purpose of the TOCFL

TOCFL test takers who passed the requirement of TOCFL will receive certificate. The certificate can serve as a Chinese proficiency credential for:

- A. Applying for the "Taiwan Scholarship".
- B. Applying for the academic programs at colleges or universities in Taiwan.

C. Serving as a reference of Chinese subject for University Entrance Committee for Overseas Chinese Students.

D. Serving as a job-required proof of Chinese language proficiency.

The certificate of TOCFL can be used as an official document when applying for admission to undergraduate and graduate programs in Taiwan. Also, many international businesses, such as LG, adopt TOCFL as reference for their employee dispatch programs in Taiwan.

## 7 TOCFL Testing Overseas

To meet the demand of numerous international Chinese learners, the SC-TOP has started to provide overseas test services since 2006. Candidates can now choose to take the TOCFL test in Japan, Korea, Thailand, Vietnam, USA, UK, and France. Also, the SC-TOP plans to increase test locations annually. 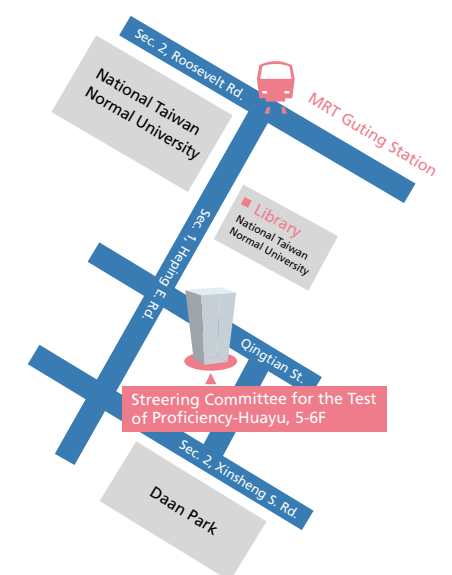

## Student Eligibility & Age

Applicants must be over 18 years old and are required to have completed at least high school education.

## Introduction

Courses are offered from beginners to advanced based on the Chinese level of the individual student. Classes are conducted in small sizes to ensure that the listening, speaking, reading and writing ability of each member can improve quickly. Students can learn Chinese based on varying and interesting subjects. They can also receive intensive help in preparing for TOCFL (Test of Chinese as Foreign Language) or HSK (Hanyu Shuiping Kaoshi or the Chinese Proficiency Test) as their request. 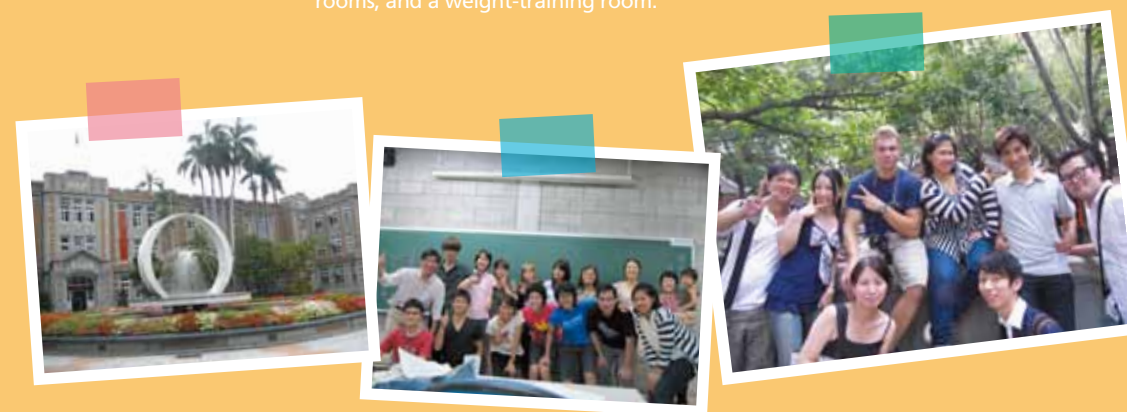

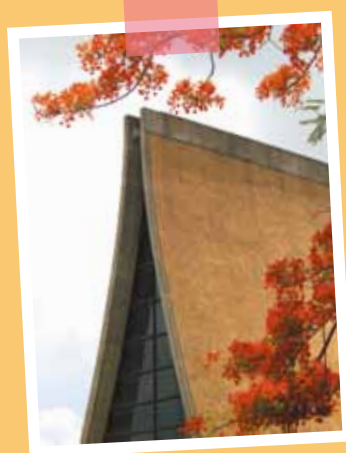

The Chinese Language Center (CLC) at Southern Taiwan University was established for international students and foreigners visiting Taiwan to help them learn the Chinese language. A variety of classes are offered depending on the student's needs. #### Scholarships

We provide two types of scholarships:

1. Admission Scholarship

**1. Admission Scholarship:** Every enrolled student who takes more than eighteen-week courses is qualified to obtain NTD 10,000.

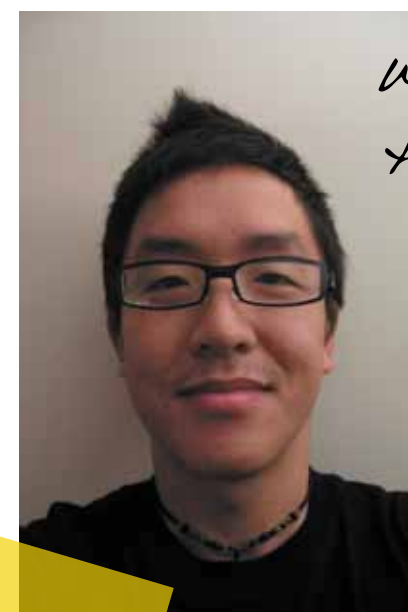
